### **Egg Competition:**



# When Flopsy and Mopsy came to visit...



# Year 5 Careers talk by Mr Guyaco





Class 7 had a lovely visit from Mr. Guyaco who explained about two fascinating jobs. They learnt how sometimes in life you can start on one career path and then move to a different career but transfer your skills to this job!

Mr. Guyaco served in the army in the Royal Artillery. Where he operated big guns and as part of his work, did tours and lived around the world.

He now works in a completely new sector of business and is a wind turbine engineer, in a sustainable energy sector. He explained to the children how he got head hunted to work with the wind turbines as he had key skills needed to climb the 120m up to the top of the turbine (either by lift or by ladder)!

He talked us through how the turbines work. He also showed us the safety equipment he uses to make sure he is safe while at work.

We were very lucky that he shared his time, experience and knowledge with us.
